- i Terrorist shooting attacks at two mosques in Christchurch, New Zealand, on 15 March 2019, which killed fifty-one, and injured forty-nine, people.
- iii The Climate Change Response (Zero Carbon) Amendment Bill 2019 was passed by the New Zealand Parliament on 7 November 2019 'to provide a framework by which New Zealand can develop and implement clear and stable climate change policies that contribute to the global effort under the Paris Agreement to limit the global average temperature increase to 1.5 degrees Celsius above preindustrial levels.'
- iii Signed in Paris, France, on 12 December 2015, the Paris Agreement builds upon the UNFCCC (United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change) with a stated central aim to strengthen the global response to the threat of climate change by keeping a global temperature rise this century below 2 degrees Celsius, and to pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase even further to 1.5 degrees Celsius.
- iv Housing the office of the prime minister, the 'Beehive' is the common name for the Executive Wing of the New Zealand Parliament Buildings in Wellington, New Zealand, so-called because its shape is reminiscent of a type of beehive.
- v The New Zealand Labour Party (Rôpū Reipa o Aotearoa), known as 'Labour', a centre-left political party in New Zealand. Ardern served as deputy leader from March to August 2017, before being elected as leader.
- vi In 1984, New Zealand's then-prime minister, David Lange, barred nuclear-powered or nuclear-armed ships from entering or using New Zealand waters, and all the sea, land and airspace of New Zealand became enshrined in legislation as nuclear-free zones.
- vii See Introduction, p. 14, paragraph 2.
- viii New Zealand's electoral system is based on Mixed Member Proportional Representation (MMP). A list MP is a member of parliament who is elected from a party list rather than from a geographical constituency.
